2020-2021 Report Summary

1. DCCD Staff taught 6 participants (ages 11-14) of the Dubois Boys and Girls Club general local ecology on July 16.
2. DCCD Staff attended a virtual SuiteWater presentation by WACD hydrologist, Cathy Rosenthal, on July 16.
3. DCCD Staff taught 14 participants (ages 9-12) of Camp Bighorn about glaciation, the formation of various types of lakes, water quality, and the general ecology and identification of macroinvertebrates in Torrey Creek on August 5.
4. DCCD Staff researched greenhouses and visited the Casper Community Gardens, Jackson Hole Slow Foods, the Huidekoper Ranch, and numerous local greenhouses to learn how best to garden in our climate.
13. DCCD Staff attended the virtual Wind River Inflow meeting on August 8.
14. DCCD Staff worked with Town of Dubois employees to transplant perennial shrubs and discuss the possibilities of a pollinator garden and overall beautification of the Dubois Town Park.
15. DCCD received and approved 5 local cost share applications; each completed project was awarded a grant. Projects included: 2 greenhouses, 1 irrigation system, 1 fencing project, and 1 bank stabilization project.
16. DCCD Staff accompanied Dave Morneau from the Popo Agie Conservation District on August 11 and members from the Wyoming DEQ, USFS, WDGf, and WACD on September 22 to fulfill part of the criteria for a water testing certification.
17. DCCD Staff participated in an NRCS Soils Health Talk in Lander on September 10.
18. DCCD Staff and Supervisor attended the WACD Area IV meeting in Medicine Bow on September 23.
19. DCCD Staff attended the virtual Boysen Coordinator discussion on September 24.
20. DCCD secured a Dubois Kiwanis Club grant to upgrade the District's existing hoop house currently used by 14 participants.
21. DCCD Staff and Supervisor attended the virtual WACD 75th Annual Convention meeting November 17-18.
22. DCCD purchased a soil testing kit and taught high school students to test garden soil and the significance of the results.
24. DCCD Staff used a biology background to help facilitate a collaborative project between the National Bighorn Sheep Center, the high school Biology students, and WDGf to analyze soils at mineral lick sites used by bighorn sheep.
25. DCCD Staff coordinated with Records Specialist, Pat Newbern, and the Wyoming Department of Audit to properly document the destruction of files that had met or exceeded their life spans.
25. DCCD Staff began its annual seedling tree sale in December.
26. DCCD circulated a public survey in December for the District's Long Range Plan.
27. DCCD Staff attended the Wyoming Legislative Session on January 9.
28. DCCD Staff accompanied NRCS Staff, Jake Hogan, to a local ranch experiencing overland ice flow on January 26.
29. DCCD completed all WASD online training modules on February 1.
30. DCCD Staff attended Farm and Ranch Days in Riverton on February 4.
31. DCCD Staff attended the online Principles of Water Quality Training I and II to earn a certificate of successful completion.
32. DCCD Staff participated in the WDEQ nutrient pollution webinar on March 4.
33. DCCD Staff earned a Pesticide Applicator's License from Fremont County Weed and Pest on March 17.
34. DCCD Staff attended a UW Entomology webinar March 22-25.
35. DCCD Staff participated in the virtual Lander Interagency Meeting on March 25.
36. DCCD Staff attended the virtual Fremont County Budget Prep Meeting on March 25.
37. DCCD Staff worked with USFSW, WWNRT, and WGFD to help fund 3 local projects.

46. DCCD cost shared 34 coliform well water tests as part of their Annual Free Well Water Test Day on June 9. 16 people chose to purchase additional tests for nitrates, sulfates, hardness, pH, chloride, and sodium.
